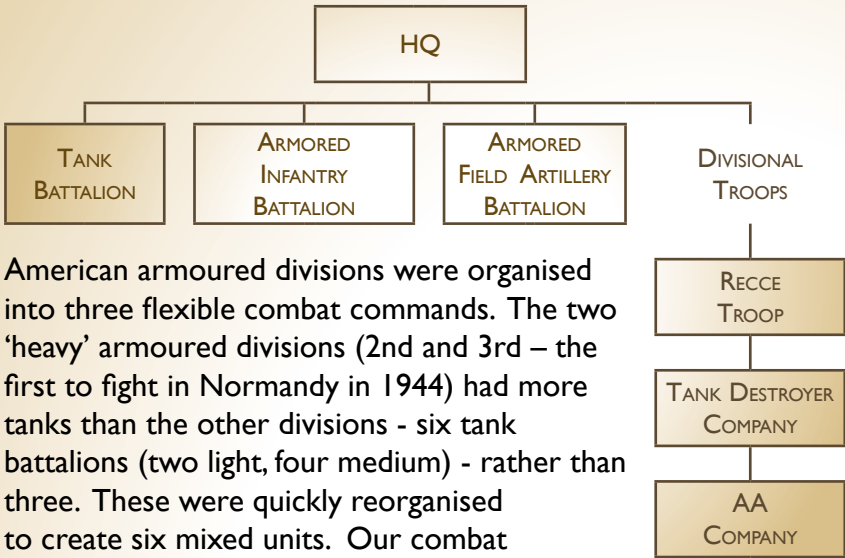




American Armored Combat Command - June 1944

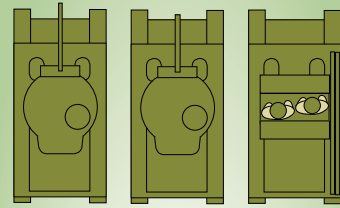


All US troops are regular for Morale.

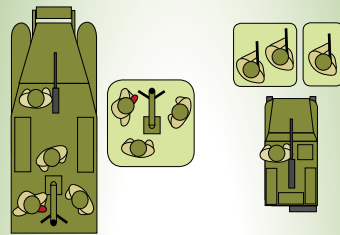
American armoured divisions were organised into three flexible combat commands. The two 'heavy' armoured divisions (2nd and 3rd – the first to fight in Normandy in 1944) had more tanks than the other divisions - six tank battalions (two light, four medium) - rather than three. These were quickly reorganised to create six mixed units. Our combat command has only one of these mixed battalions (smaller than the 'light' division version, which has another company of medium tanks), but a second could be added. The combat command also has a battalion of armoured infantry in M3 half-tracks, well armed with heavy weapons and bazookas, a battalion of self propelled 105mm guns and attached reconnaissance, tank destroyer and anti-aircraft units. After mid-July replace one Sherman 75mm in each company with a 76mm-armed M4A1.

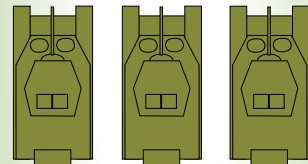

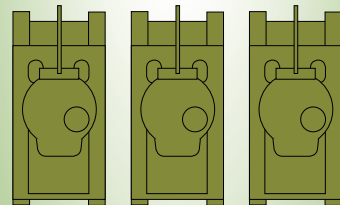

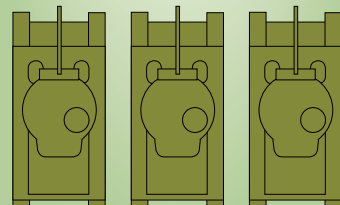
