

## Spanish Civil War: Improvised & Unusual Vehicles

Los Tiznaos notes:

- APCs cannot fire any heavy weapons even if transporting them.
- An APC can transport up to 8 infantry figures, paid for separately and up to four can fire from each side.
- IFV can transport up to 4 infantry figures, paid for separately and up to two can fire from each side. APC's and IFVs are extremely unstable, they cannot move & fire;
- AFVs can move & fire

IAV random speed generator

These Improvised Armoured Vehicles existed in a bewildering array of combinations and often overloaded the chassis that they were built onto. So I recommend that you roll randomly for each such vehicle employed and do it at the start of each game, so the owning player is never quite sure how these will perform.

- APC types +1 to die roll

Notes:

The table above lists various oddities might have made it into Combat. Amazingly they all have some basis in fact. Those marked \* were prototypes only, the Oteyzal was based in the Civil Guard barracks in Madrid. The Citroen was an 'evaluation' vehicle purchased in 1932. The Trubia A might have been so converted at the factory; the Panzer 1b would have been a field/workshop conversion. The Vickers Type B (supposedly a donation from Paraguay) maybe a myth. Allow max 1 such vehicle per side from the date shown
